NTE348 Silicon NPN Transistor RF Power Amp, Driver

Description:

The NTE348 is a silicon NPN transistor in a T72H type package designed primarily for use in 12.5V VHF large-signal power amplifier applications required in military and industrial equipment to 300MHz.

Features:

- Specified 12.5V, 175MHz Characteristics:
 - Output Power = 4W
 - Minimum Gain = 12dB
 - Efficiency = 50%
