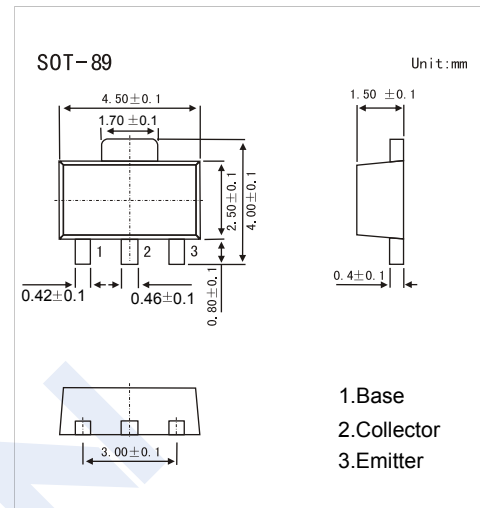

■ Features

- Low $V_{CE(sat)}$.
 $V_{CE(sat)} = -0.35V$ (Typ.)
($I_C/I_B = -4A / -0.1A$)
- Excellent DC current gain
- Epitaxial planar type
- PNP silicon transistor

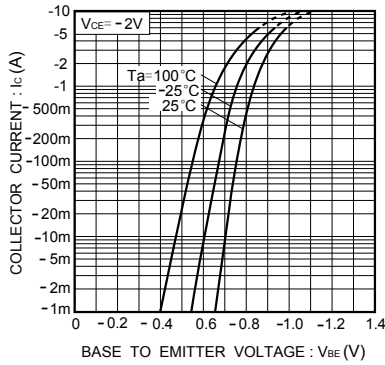


Fig.1 Grounded emitter propagation characteristics

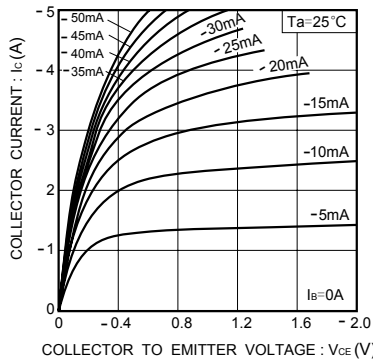


Fig.2 Grounded emitter output characteristics

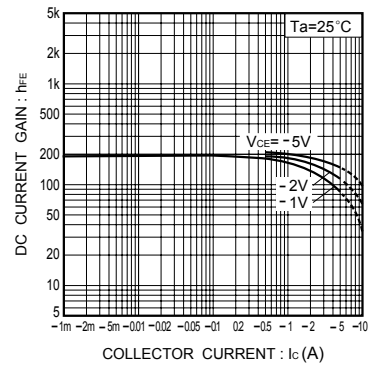


Fig.3 DC current gain vs. collector current (I)

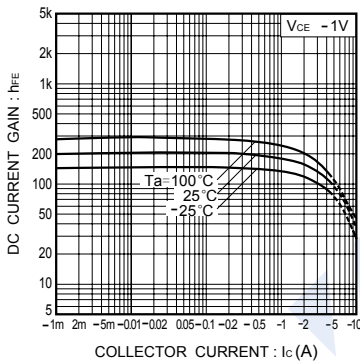


Fig.4 DC current gain vs. collector current (II)

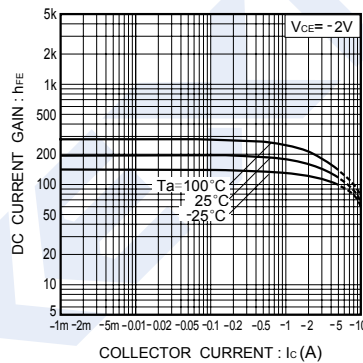


Fig.5 DC current gain vs. collector current (III)

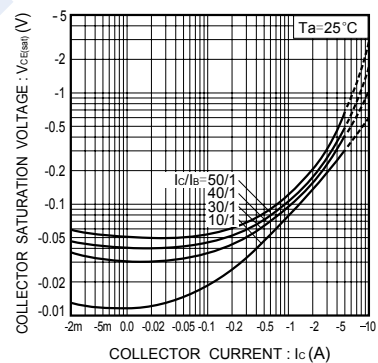


Fig.6 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current (I)

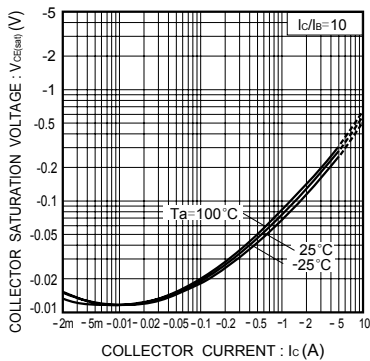


Fig.7 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current (II)

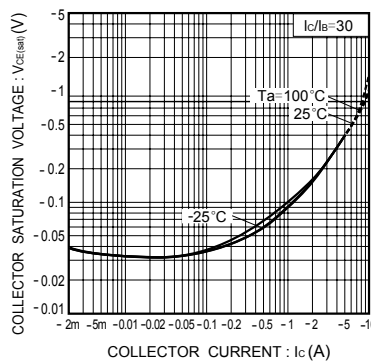


Fig.8 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current (III)

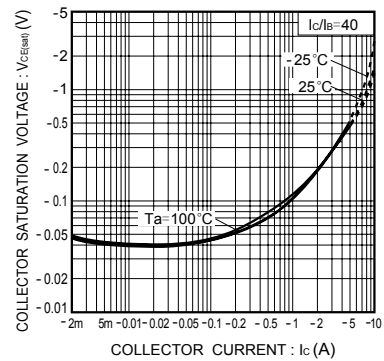


Fig.9 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current (IV)

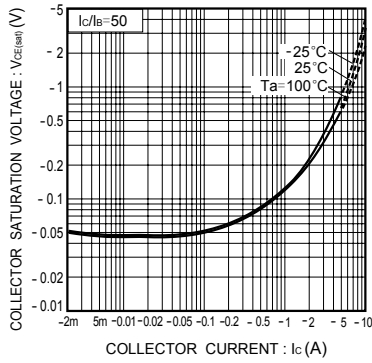


Fig.10 Collector-emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current (V)

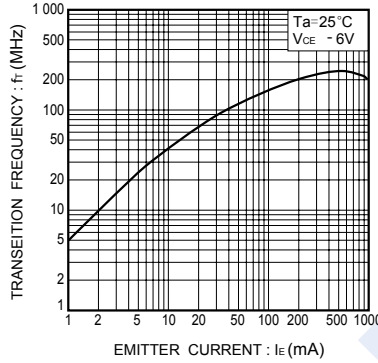


Fig.11 Gain bandwidth product vs. emitter current

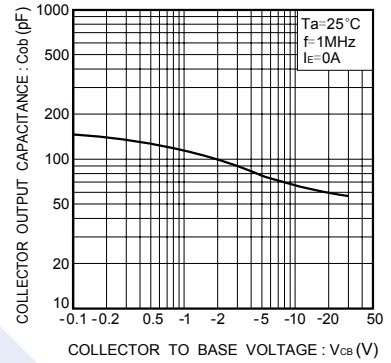


Fig.12 Collector output capacitance vs. collector-base voltage

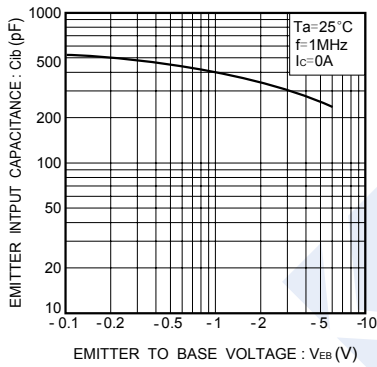


Fig.13 Emitter input capacitance vs. emitter-base voltage

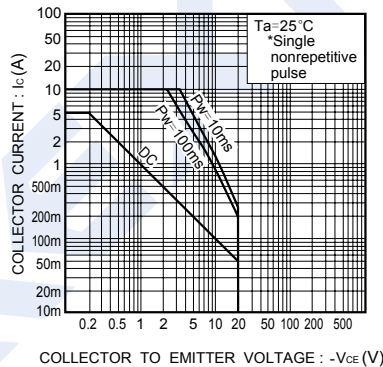


Fig.14 Safe operation area
